Reminder:

The center will **not be open** on Columbus Day, **Monday, October 12th**.

The Kindergarten class will be visiting the Fire Station on Wed, October 7th. The firemen will be coming to the school to visit with Rooms B (t-th), C1 (t-th), E (t-th) & D on Tuesday, October 13th and for Rooms B (m-w-f), C1 (m-w-f), C2 & E on Friday, October 16th.

We would like to remind you that our space is limited for bedding. Also, it is important that bedding be stored in plastic bagging to prevent the transfer of bacteria and/or other critters. A shopping store size plastic bag is an appropriate size for us to store bedding. Please bring a small travel pillow, crib size sheet blanket (fleece works nice) in a plastic bag to school on the first day of the week that your child comes to school. We will return them the same way on your child's last day of the school week. We appreciate your cooperation, as this is a health, as well as a space concern.

Also, we would like to clarify some information concerning the front pocket of our yellow school bags. Although, some teachers are using a file folder system to send home daily or weekly class work, the front pocket is for important communications between the parent and the school. We would like to remind parents and teachers to check this pocket daily.

Please be reminded that all children are required by law to have a medical report on file **each year** at school. The state requires, at admission, proof that each child has been successfully immunized in accordance to the current department of public health, and a physician's certificate that he/she is in good health be on file within 60 days of admission.
